The MRI Rapid Access Anaphylaxis Clinic Instructions for Referrers

Aim of the clinic:

To see patients within 7 days of an event

To record details of the event and take blood for baseline tryptase (if required)

To discuss if carriage of self-injectable adrenaline should be considered

To discuss an emergency management plan in case of further events

To plan future allergy testing (if relevant)

Suitable referrals include:

First presentation with anaphylaxis from the community

Exclusions from the clinic (referrals will be rejected):

Incomplete patient details / contact details

Drug allergy suspected (refer via the normal route)

Anaesthetic drug allergy (refer via AAGBI form - http://bit.ly/aagbiref)

Where the clinical features were not severe / consistent with the NICE CG 134 definition of anaphylaxis

For patients from / in the MRI

Preferably refer patients using the ICE electronic referral, but if not accessible use the paper form on the web page
