From my own experience, having people around me to support my progression is always reassuring and I find this to be a huge benefit of doing an apprenticeship. It's also a chance to leap into the unknown and fully emerge yourself within a career that allows you to personally develop and grow. Therefore, whatever sector an apprentice decides to choose, they will be safe in the knowledge that they have supportive colleagues to help guide them and want the best for them. I would recommend picking a career that interests you and this could be inspired by something already experienced in life or inspired by someone else's career. I have friends and family in construction but had never seen myself as an engineer initially.
