

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR YOUR ATTENTION REGARDING NEW STORAGE LAWS-July 2022.

Please not that on 1 July 2022 legislation governing the storage of gametes and embryos in the UK changed. The <u>Health and Care Act 2022</u> introduced amendments to the Human Fertilisation and Embryology (HFEA) Act 1990 (the 1990 Act) changing the current 10 year statutory storage limit.

These changes enable patients to consent to embryos being stored for treatment purposes for up to a maximum of 55 years; gametes can be stored for up to 55 years for treatment, research or training purposes, and embryos and human admixed embryos can be stored for research or training purposes for up to 10 years. There are also new provisions relating to storage for posthumous use and in the event of mental incapacity. This will be explained to you by clinical staff within the Department. Patients can renew their consent to store their gametes or embryos for use in their own treatment for a maximum of 55 years, **but only if they 'renew' their consent to storage**, and this must take place within 10 years of first storage and at each successive 10-year period.

Donors storing gametes or embryos can give consent to storage for 55 years and are **not** required to renew their consent.

Patients will be contacted by the Department of Reproductive medicine **at least 12 months before your current consent expires** with a copy of the relevant HFEA statutory notice to ask if they wish to renew their consent for a further 10 years (or less). Consent can only be renewed if you contact us to complete the new HFEA renewal forms in line with contact details within the letter sent to you by the Department.

## Updated consent forms

**Please note:** HFEA have updated their consent forms and **even if** you have already completed consent forms you will be asked to complete the new forms which have been introduced as per below (for information only).

Treatment and storage forms

<u>MT</u> - Your consent to your sperm and embryos created outside the body using your sperm being used in treatment (IVF and ICSI) or stored

<u>WT - Your consent to your eqgs and embryos created using your eqgs being used in</u> treatment (IVF and ICSI) or stored

<u>WPT - Your consent to providing eggs or embryos created with your eggs for your partner's</u> <u>treatment</u>

MGI - Your consent to the use of your sperm in artificial insemination



<u>WGI - Your consent to the use of your eggs in GIFT</u> <u>GS - Your consent to the storage of your eggs or sperm</u>
