Patch Passport



What is a patch passport?

A patch passport is worn on the child's strong eye to encourage the brain to use the weaker eye and strengthen vision.

This information is used to pass information between parents, teachers, the visual impairment team and the orthoptist. It lets us know how your child is getting on with their patching treatment. You can use it to write any updates or questions you may have.

Parents: please ensure your child brings their patching passport to school, home and their hospital appointments.
