Information for Patients

Advice following an intravitreal injection

Following an injection:

- 1) Wash your hands regularly and avoid touching your eye.
- 2) Avoid splashing any water in your eye for three days.
- 3) Only use a clean disposable tissue around your eye area.
- 4) If you're prescribed eye drops, please start using from the day after your injection.

What to expect after the intravitreal injection

- **Blurred vision:** On the day of the injection your vision may be more blurred for a few hours. This should slowly clear during the day. Persistent or worsening pain or redness the next day needs to be reported using the contact numbers given below.
- **Bubbles in the vision**: These are very tiny bubbles which are commonly in the liquid injected, this is normal and will gradually disperse over a few days. New floaters which do not settle down or worsen during the day need to be reported.
- **Pain and redness**: It is normal to experience some discomfort for a few hours after your injection, you should take pain relief medication for example Paracetamol or Ibuprofen unless contraindicated. If it gets worst, please report.
