PATIENT INFORMATION LEAFLET

OUTPATIENT MEDICAL TERMINATION OF PREGNANCY <10WEEKS

This leaflet aims to give you information regarding your outpatient (at home) medical termination of pregnancy, under 10 weeks. If there is anything you are unsure of then please contact a member of the Whitworth Clinic team at any time. You can find contact details at the end of this leaflet.

Your treatment will be a two-stage procedure as discussed in your consultation. Please use this leaflet as a reference/reminder of how to complete the treatment.

131 STAGE - MIFEPRISTONE
Date: Time:
This blocks hormones to the pregnancy and prepares the womb for the 2nd part of the procedure.
This will usually cause cramping, vaginal bleeding and vomiting. If you vomit within 2 hours of taking your tablet, please call the Whitworth Clinic for advice.
2 ND STAGE- MISOPROSTOL
Take 36-48 hours after mifepristone, the morning of
This will usually cause cramping and vaginal bleeding often with clots within the first 4 hours. You may experience a fever, nausea/feeling sick, vomiting or diarrhoea.
We expect you to bleed heavily with clots for around 2 hours. If you have any heavy bleeding with clots for longer than 2 hours or pain that is not being controlled by the pain relief prescribed, please call the emergency numbers below. If you feel extremely unwell go to your nearest A&E.
We advise that you do not need to look out for pregnancy tissue, dispose of your sanitary towels as

normal and go to the toilet as normal.

Have your breakfast as usual and if needed you can take anti-sickness medication.

Insert the Diclofenac suppository into your rectum/back passage. Please wash your hands with soap and water after. Insert 4 tablets of misoprostol between your gum and cheek /your lower gum two on each side. If you are vomiting/being sick insert them into your vagina. Take your pain killers as the nurses in clinic have explained.

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After 4 hours, swallow the 2 extra doses of misoprostol in your pack.



If you are vomiting or feel very sick, you can insert 4 tablets into the vagina.

If you require any further information or clarification of terminology, please do not hesitate to talk to one of the doctors or nurses, who will be happy to discuss your concerns with you.
