## What is the purpose of a forward plan?

The purpose of the forward plan for our NHS Foundation Trust is to set out, in the context of our long-term vision and strategic aims, our operational delivery plans for the coming year. Specifically, it describes for the next 12 month period, how we plan to deliver all of our targets and aspirations in relation to activity, quality, safety and performance and any service developments, all within budget.

#### What areas do the plans cover?

As part of our planning process, each year our Hospitals, Managed Clinical Services and Corporate Departments set out their key priorities, which are their 'must dos' for the coming year and how they are going to be achieved. The plans cover improving the quality of care and patient experience, developing our services and our staff, extending our research studies and achieving financial stability.

## Who is involved in producing the plans?

Staff from across our Hospitals, Managed Clinical Services and Corporate Departments all help to develop our plans. We work with external stakeholders including partner organisations to ensure that our plans are aligned. We also seek the views of our patients, their families and the wider community; by understanding their views we can shape our services so that they better meet the needs of all the people that we serve.
