

North West GLH Genomics Tumour Advisory Boards

To assist with interpretation of genomic reports for cancer patients, the North West Genomics Laboratory Hub (GLH) is offering support through several advisory board meetings. We encourage referrals for discussion where clinical teams may be uncertain about interpretation of a result e.g. regarding treatment selection, clinical trial opportunities, how to approach potential germline findings or for general education and upskilling.

The scope and timings of available meetings are described below. If uncertain as to which meeting to refer to, please complete the referral form [Referral Forms - Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust](#) and email: mdt-coordinators.nwglh@mft.nhs.uk. and the GLH will triage to the most appropriate forum.

- **ctDNA GTAB** – 2nd and 4th Fridays of the month at 12:00pm
 - For discussion regarding circulating tumour DNA (ctDNA) reports. Attended by scientific and clinical personnel from the GLH and open to all clinical staff to attend. Open to all queries regarding ctDNA reports, variant interpretation and actionability queries (for ctDNA specific queries please email mft.northwest.ctdna@nhs.net)
- **Inherited Cancer MDT** – 1st Tuesday of the month at 11:00am
 - For discussion regarding a potential germline finding identified on a genomic report. Attended by clinical geneticists (North West regions – Manchester and Liverpool Clinical Genetics) and scientific/clinical personnel from the NWGLH. Advice will be given on whether confirmatory germline testing is required and whether referral to clinical genetics is indicated. This is the required route to access clinical genetics services in these cases. Direct referrals to clinical genetics may be re-routed through this meeting
- **WGS GTAB** – 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month at 12:30pm
 - For discussion regarding whole genome sequencing (WGS) results. Attended by scientific and clinical personnel from the GLH and open to all clinical staff to attend. GLH will guide which cases should be discussed

If a case is referred to any of the meetings above, attendance from a member of the clinical team is strongly encouraged to present the case and ensure outcomes of the meeting can be actioned and recorded in patient EPRs
